We learned then what it m ant to our boys, and to the homes four nation, present and furture, to have dens of vice and swarms of vampires surrpiunding our military camps and crowding themselves into the very faces of tur young men.

We learned that at a time when England net/ sorely needed menthat 200,000 of her soldiers were inhospita s w th social disease, incapacitated for work, a burder to the nation and a menace to its future

So America profited by what she had learned and it is to the credit of our congressman Ed C. Little that the famous Zone bill was passed which has protected our boys from polution and has sent them a cross the water proud oftheir morals as well as of their morale.

This / The application of the Zone law is being amplified to cover campes of 250 men for thirty days. We are making headway. The world is going to learn of American efficiency in the war an how that efficiency was maintained.

One of the rewards of peace will be temperance. Never again will the liquor interests of the world be permitted to debauch ankind as it has in the past.
