## TWELFTH BIENNIAL REUNION

The twelfth biennial meeting of the Gowdy Family Union will be held at the residence of Willard H. Gowdy, in the East Wallop district, in the Town of Enfield, Connecticut, on Saturday, August 6, 1938.
