We have had a very delightful summer so far. I left Lawrence on the 9th and returned on the 24th and my recording thermometer indicated a high during that period of 95 and a low of 54. Last Sunday afternoon I turned on the oil burner to the furnace at my home.

We have had a lot of rain and everything looks very beautiful. In fact we have had a little too much rain for wheat harvest but it is pleasant today and a lot can be accomplished when men can get in the fields.
