
Dear Sir:

In response to your inquiry of May 24th, please be advised the Government furnished marble headstones of regulation design as illustrated on the inclosed blanks, for the graves of ex-service men. These, however, are furnished only for the unmarked graves of veterans.

If the stone to which you refer marks the individual grave, it is not possible for this office to furnish a headstone. If, on the other hand, the stone marks the lot in which the grave is located and the Government stone is desired, application therefor may be made on the inclosed blanks.
