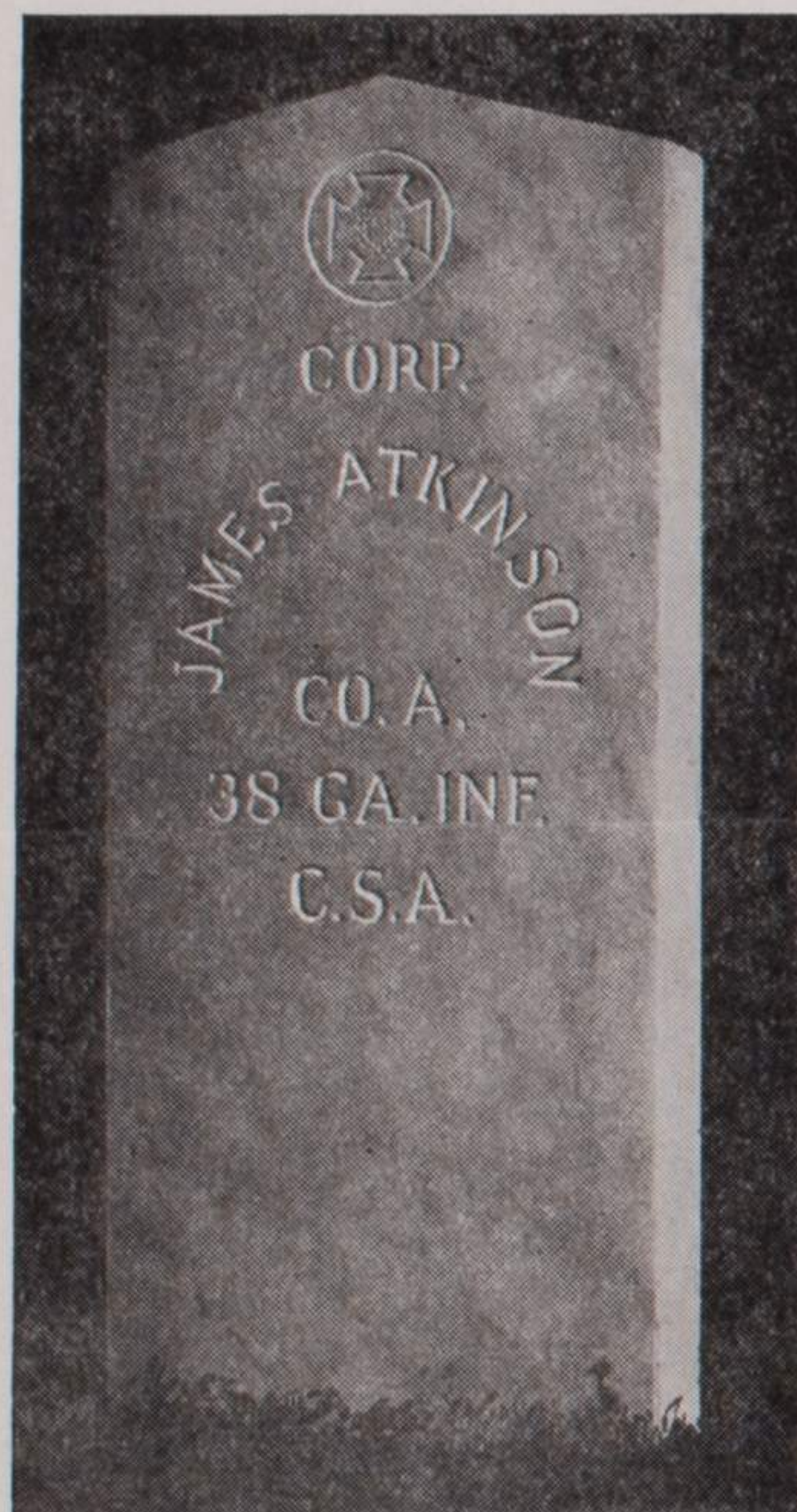


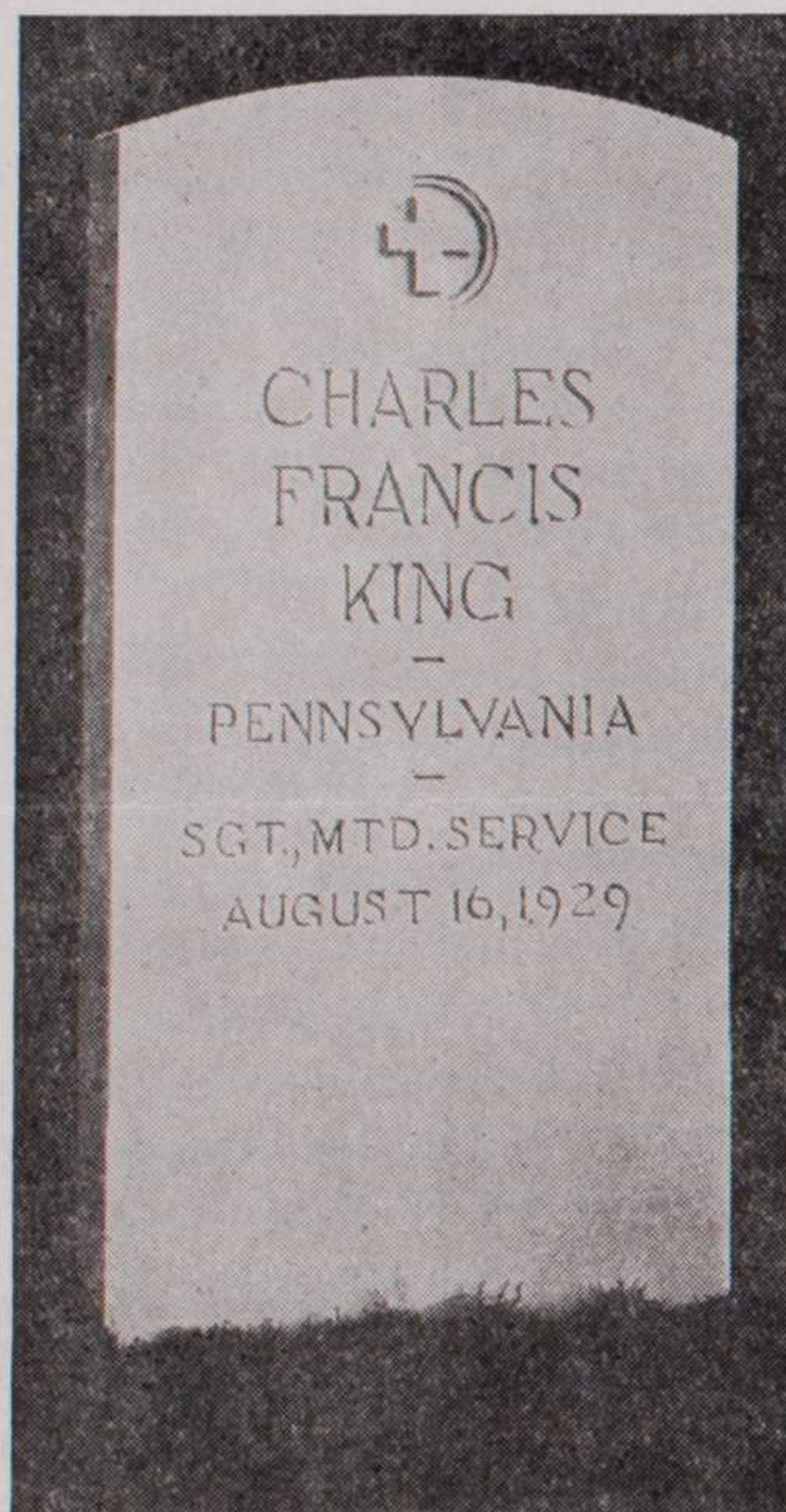
For Veterans of the
Confederate States Army



39 inches long, 12 inches wide, 4 inches thick; top is slightly pointed; inscribed with name, rank (if above a private), and organization, followed by the letters "C. S. A." Date of death not inscribed on this stone.

UPRIGHT MARKER

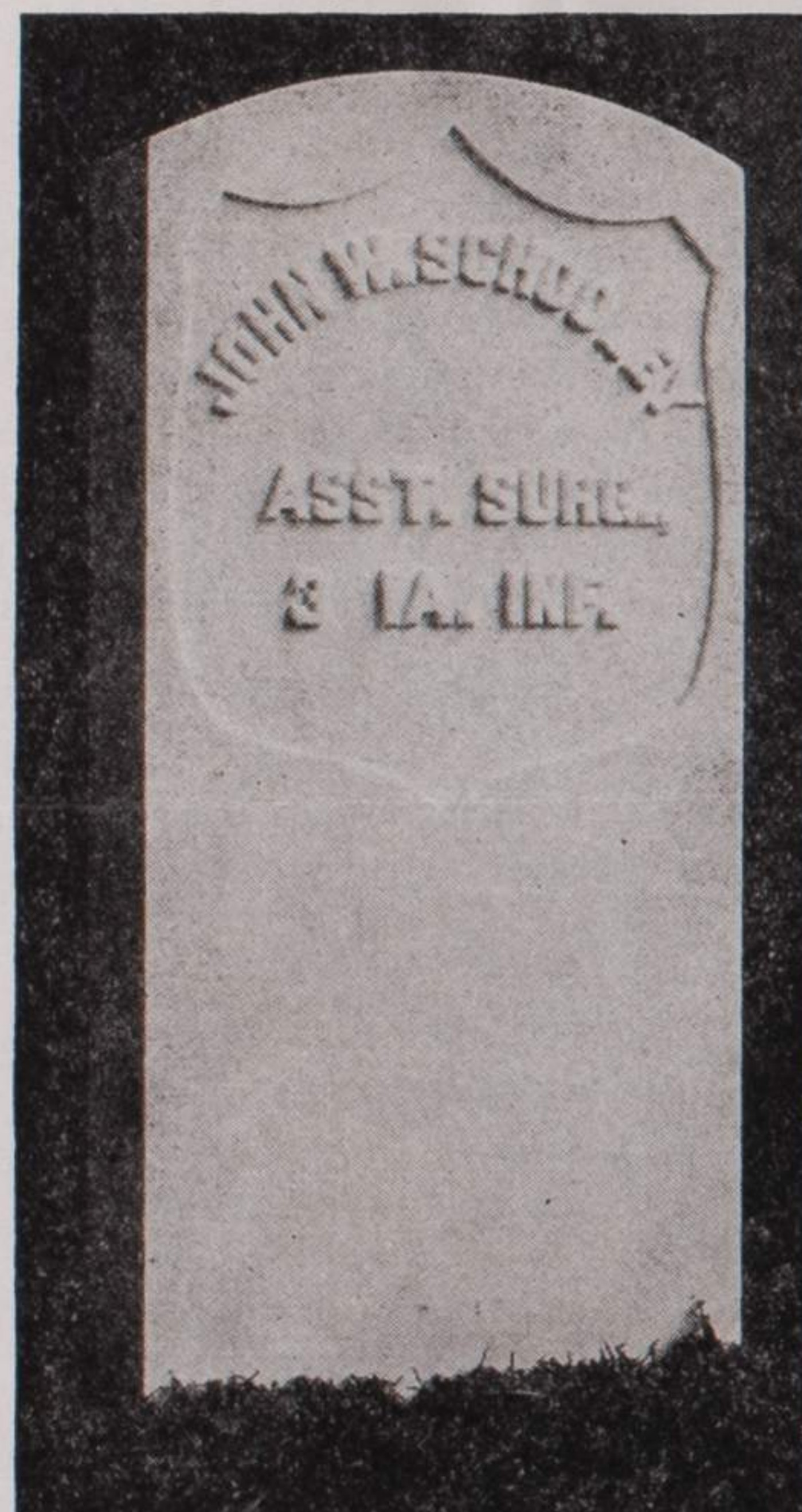
For ALL VETERANS EXCEPT those
of the CIVIL and
SPANISH-AMERICAN WARS



42 inches long, 13 inches wide, 4 inches thick. Within a small circle above the inscription will be cut either a Latin Cross for Christians, or Star of David for Hebrews, or no emblem, as elected.

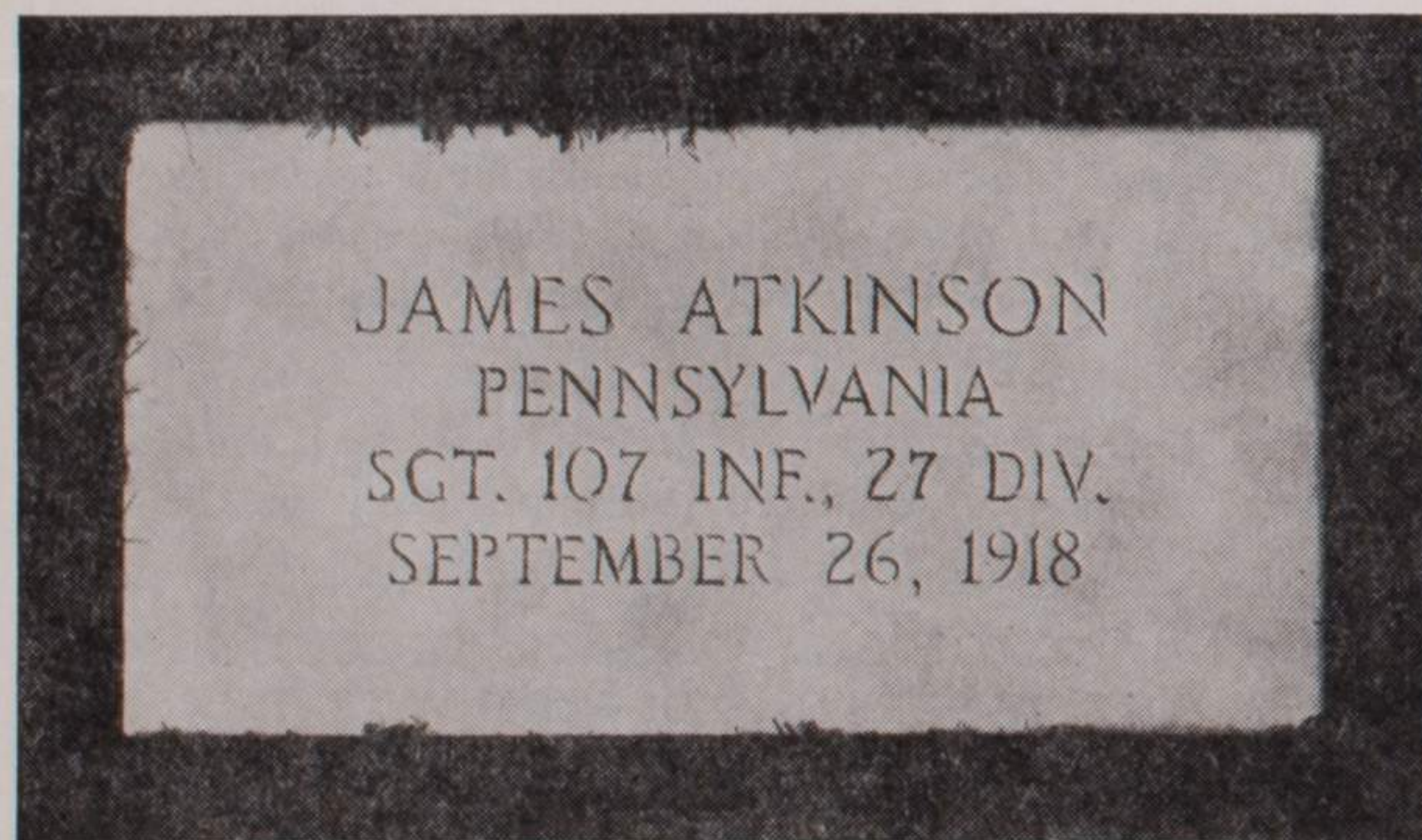
Under "Emblem" strike out all but the one chosen. The inscription will consist of the full name of the soldier, the State from which he came, his rank, regiment, division, and date of death.

For Civil War (April 15, 1861–August 20, 1865) and Spanish War (April 21, 1898–April 11, 1899) Veterans



39 inches long, 12 inches wide, 4 inches thick. Top is slightly rounded, with inscription which consists of the name, rank (if above a private), and organization, all cut within a sunken shield. Date of death not inscribed on this stone.

"Sp. Am. War" is added to the above inscription to indicate service in that war.



FLAT MARKER

For all Veterans who served in the Armed Forces of the United
States and Confederate States.

24 inches long, 12 inches wide, and 4 inches thick. Placed flush with the ground. Inscription will be placed parallel to the greatest dimension on the stone and will consist of the full name of the veteran, the State from which he came, his rank, regiment, and date of death. There will be no religious or other emblems or shield on this marker.

THE ABOVE PICTURES SHOW HOW THE STONES APPEAR AFTER ERECTION AT GRAVE

All headstones are of American white marble. No deviation can be made from these specifications. No additional inscription, such as name of company, troop, or battery in which the veteran served, or date of birth can be furnished at Government expense. Any additional inscription may be cut on the headstones at private expense.
