Dear Sir:

Your permit and check for Memorial Marker received for grave of Dr. John Buckley.

In your case I would suggest the staff marker which may be set in cement underground, as shown in cut I am inclosing. The lugs, which are about 2 inches long with a little spread at the end, are to be attached to the tombstone by being set in cement-filled holes bored into the stone. As your stone would have to be dressed in order to attach the plaque, which measures about $8\frac{1}{4}$ by $10\frac{1}{4}$ inches, I think you will be safe in the above suggestion.
