Dear Sir:

The National Society United States Daughters of 1812 have arranged to mark the grave of Dr. John Buckley who was a private in Capt. Jacob Elliston's Company of Johnson's Mounted, Regular Kentucky Volunteers 1812.

John Buckley was born in the state of Virginia on October 16, 1783. Died in Lawrence, Kansas on March 3, 1875. I am advised that a free government marker may be secured by addressing you. If your records show the town in Virginia where Dr. Buckley was born, I shall be glad to have that data. My mother-in-law, Mrs. Louisa J. Buckley Reineke, is living with us and had her 94th birthday on March 22, 1938.

The grave is marked with a granite stone, engraved with the name Buckley, but with no data in regard to John Buckley.

I was advised to submit this matter to you by Mrs. Louisa Cooke Don Carlos, chairman grave location of the Daughters of 1812.

It is quite likely that the father of John Buckley served in the Revolutionary War but I have no data to that effect.
