Gentlemen:

While a member of the cruise taken by the Nieuw Amsterdam around South America we contracted with Mr. Charles d'Emery of the Manugian Studios, South Norwalk, Connecticut, for 1200 feet of colored films. We returned to New York on March 29th and it was our understanding that the films would be ready for us in about five weeks. It is just ten weeks ago today since we returned and we have not received our pictures.
