Probably a duplicate of this intricate weave could not be found in this whole country but for from twenty five to thirty ~~five~~ dollars I can get a hand woven coverlet to drape my windows and I will use the substitute so this one may go where it is fitting ~~tha~~ it stay.

It is in reasonably good repair. By that I mean that its' age is well indicated but it is in no respects delapidated. An expert needlewoman offered to furnish the threads and mend all the worn places for five dollars. My friend who for many years was head of the Home Economics department of the college here insisted that I hang it exactly as it is and I plan to use it that way unless some of your citizens want it for thirty dollars.

The information about the weaver was most interesting and I thank you for it.
