

Raymond Gilkeson Elected Head of Farm Publications

Raymond Gilkeson, of Topeka, editor of the Kansas Farmer and Missouri Ruralist, was elected

president of the American Agricultural Editors Association at the annual meeting Wednesday in Chicago.

Gilkeson has been vice-president of the organization for the past two years. Membership in the association includes editors of all types of farm papers in the United States. Combined circulation of all the papers represented is more than 50,000,000.

"Farm publications generally have done such good work in selling war bonds and in boosting scrap-metal and fat-saving campaigns," Gilkeson said yesterday. "that they have received special awards of merit from the secretary of the United States Treasury."

The association's program for the year ahead, the new president announced, will be continued emphasis on everything from food production to saving wastepaper that will help win the war.
