Bambridge upon which the said Campbelle told her that he was the Lord Chief Justice Eyre And this Examinant further saith That about an Hour ago Shee this Examinant saw the same person (whom she took for a priest with her said Master Bambridge) sitting between two Judges upon a Bench on the Right Hand in Westminster Hall And this Exam^t further saith That to no other person that came to visit the said Bambridge during the Thirteen Weeks that this Examinant attended the said Bambridge whilst in Newgate did he pay the Compliment as to this person whom she supposed to be a priest by the Manner of his Complaisance.
