And this Examinant further saith that it was about the latter End of February last that the abovementioned M^r. Campbell asked this Examinant about the prison And that it was on the Fifth of March following that this Examinant went with the said Campbell to Serjeants Inn in Chancery Lane, as abovementioned

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James Brown being Examined in the most solemn manner this Twentieth day of April 1730, - Saith That about ten days before the House of Commons broke up the last Session He this Examinant dined with Thomas Bambridge in the Goal of Newgate. And soon after Dinner a gentleman came up to M^r. Bambridge and as soon as the said Gentleman entered the Room where the said Bambridge was - this Examinant and one Johnson who was then also present rose and went out of the Room. And this Examinant passed by the said Gentleman within a Yard of him and looked the said Gentleman full in the Face who was a round visaged Man with red-Complexion and a black Wigg and a full Stature of Body who remained with M^r. Bambridge about two Hours And this Examinant was reading when the said Gentleman came down from M^r. Bambridge's Chamber
