 (Bambridge) a Visit. And this Examinant afterwards
 having a Tryal at the Court of Common pleas this
 Examinant saw the Lord Chief Justice Eyre sitting
 on the Bench of the said Court which said Lord Chief
 Justice Eyre was the same person this Examinant saw
 with the said Bambridge in Newgate And it being
 alledged that the press yard was no part of Newgate
 being held by a separate Lease This Examinant at
 the time of the said Tryal was going to speak the
 following Words to the said Lord Chief Justice Eyre Esq.
 "When your Lordship did Mr. Bambridge the Honour
 "to visit him at Newgate, you stood in the press yard
 "when you asked what place is this pointing to the
 "cells, which Mr. Bambridge answered is the cells My
