

Roger Johnson being Examined this Three
 and Twentieth day of April 1730. in the most
 Solemn Manner Saith That he hath known
 Mr. West many Yeares And being asked whether
 he hath seen West any little time before Beatniff
 came with him This Examinant Saith That he
 Saw West Singly and Beatniff Singly And being
 asked whether he had ever sent Messages by

 Examinant and told him Mr. Bambridge would

 out To which this Examinant answered He
 would not Employ him And this Examinant
 Saith that he doth know John Campbelle who
 is Reputed an Attorney And that he remembers
 about the time Everett was Hanged he saw John
 Campbelle but had no particular Conversation
 with him And that he had been in his Room
 whilst Bambridge was there, That he had
 no Quarrell with Campbelle But when Colonel
 Chartres was there walking in the Yard This
 Examinant.
