

The Letter annexed to Roger Johnson's Examinations Says that Letter is the hand writing of Richard Beatniffe.

Being asked how he knew it to be his Hand Writing — Says that when he was Clerk to Mr. Bambridge Mr. Beatniffe and the Examinant wrote some Four, Five or Six Days together at Mr. Bambridge's Chambers in the Kings Bench Walks and the Examinant Examined Beatniffe's Hand Writing with several other Writings.

Being asked What those Writings were — Says That they were petitions to the Lord Chancellours and some Affidavits about Bambridge's own Affairs.

Are you Single or Married? I am Married to Mr. Birnie. Was you at the Old Bayly when Bambridge was Tryed for Felony? I was. Had you any Conversation with Bambridge? Yes.
