

Eyre, or if he was to be tryed by Mr Justice Reynolds who was then upon the Bench. What Answer did he give you? He told me by L^d C. J. Eyre: I sayd it was not consistent with his Lordship's Honour, and your Interest to be tryed by him, I thought he did not intend to try you, To which Bambridge reply'd, By God hee shall try me, he dares not but try me, for I have his Life (snapping his fingers) between my finger & Thumb. What could cause you to give Bambridge such Advice? It had been very commonly reported that Bambridge and Lord Chief Justice Eyre had been very great, there was a story about a Ship, but this is mostly Heare say and mostly come from Bambridge himself. What was there particular that Bambridge sayd to you? I have heard him say sometimes that he never had a Favour from Lord Chief Justice Eyre in his Life and in a small time after, in a Day or Two I have heard him declare that he had received a great many Preindships from him, but ^{he} swears and forswears so often that there is no beleiving him. Where was Bambridge when he sayd this? In Newgate.

Have you seen Bambridge lately? Yes - about Three or Four Days ago. Where did you see him? He sent to me and I went to him, and he sayd he had heard I had made an Affidavit before
