He said if I had a Mind to redeem my Husband from his Misfortunes, and not have him thrown into a Goal to perish, I must write a Letter to him (Bambridge) wherein he would have me declare all that I might have heard either from Mr. Hughes, Mr. Harbidge, or Mr. Campbelle or any of the Gentlemen of the Committee and that I would in that Letter insinuate that I thought the Witnesses that had given Evidence at the Committee were not come by fairly and he would deliver that Letter if I sent it, to the Lord Chief Justice. — Did he name what Lord Chief Justice? It was Lord Chief Justice Eyre we were speaking of, and he (Bambridge) said that he would take Care that every thing should be done for me, and my Lord would take Care that my Brother should do me Justice, and he wished Campbelle would write such a Letter too, ^{or} he would be undone if he did not.
