

You say that Bambridge would have had — you wrote what conversation you had with Campbell and Harbing; Have you had any conversation with them? Yes. What acquaintance had you with them? I have known Mr. Campbell for several years. Have they had any Discourse with you about this Committee? Yes they have asked me what I knew of matters. Did they make use of any Gentlemen's names? They brought me to Mr. Hughes to make an Affidavit. Did they often talk with you about this Affair? It has been talked of as common Discourse. We have talked about this matter as a matter of common conversation.

Was that Letter which Bambridge desired you would write to be directed to him? Yes.

What is your Husband? An Advocate of the Kingdom of Scotland and a Doctor of Physick. Who is your Brother? Mr. How of Gloucestershire he is my half Brother.

Did Harbing and Campbell ever say they talked about this Affair with any Gentlemen? Who did they say desired them to speak to you? They said they were desired by Mr. Ogleshorpe and Mr. Hughes to ask what I knew of any of these Affairs.

What was it induced you to alter your Resolution of not coming to be Examined? I have received two Orders since, and Mr. Bambridge daring to say that he would bring Twenty Witnesses to say I was not there
