 Tavern at Charing Cross. Did you talk any thing of
 this Letter there recollect? You may as well desire
 me to recollect everything since I was born. Did you
 never meet Campbell at any other Tavern at any
 other time? I have met him very often, I have been
 with him at a Tavern alone about Business. Did
 you never go to a Tavern on purpose to talk about this
 thing? I don't know that I did. Can you recollect at
 how many Taverns you have been with Campbell?
