I received some from Smithfield from Grassids, some from Barnard Street, some from Rowney Marsh, some from one Ashford of Bear-Hoy, & some from a - Hoyman, and Bank Bills I have received. - Can you give an Account of Bambridges Circumstances when he was first committed? When Bambridge was first taken in Custody, he Lodged at my House, He came home pretty early in the Evening and went up into his own Apartment and desired to speak to me, and said was there any thing in his Apartment that I wanted out for he should not stay that night I asked him what was the Meaning? He said he believed the House of Commons had order'd him into Custody & as he was opening his Scrutore and he took out severall Bank Bills and a purse of Gold, I said what are you taking with you all your Money, you'll run away, He said I have no Guilt upon me, and so I am under no fears, about twelve o'clock he came down into the parlour, and went away, after he went to Newgate, he desired I would send him those papers that lay in his Room and the Money, accordingly I did and there was severall Guineas, Two Guineas wrapp'd up in a paper, and some Silver.
