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hundred Guineas from Alderman Child. ^{but} I did not receive it all at one time. Where had you the note? It was payable to himself. From whom did these Bills come? They came from severall Tenants out of the Countrey. How do you know that? Because I have ^{seen} the people's Names on the Bills and Letters directed for me at my House. About what time did you receive the Money from Alderman Child, was it at his Tryale? I can't recollect, I remember I received fifty pounds from a grocer in Smithfield. Where was Bambridge when you delivered that Letter to Huggins? At Mr. Pope's the Messenger's House. Did you ever bring the sum of a hundred Guineas from Lord Chief Justice Eyre or any other sum to Bambridge? No, I never was with Lord Chief Justice Eyre. Did you carry any Letter to Lord Chief Justice Eyre or any body in Serjeants Inn? No, I never carried but that one Letter to ^{Mr.} Huggins. Was you ever desired to carry a Letter from Bambridge to any body at Serjeants Inn? No. Were these Notes Bank Notes or Bills drawn upon Mr. Child? I can't recollect, I think they were Bills payable to Mr. Bambridge Mr. Child's were Notes. What were those Notes you received out of the Countrey? They were Notes that were sent by Tenants out of the Countrey to be paid in Town, I carried them to the Men who was to pay them to accept them, and then they paid them. Where had you that Note of a hundred pounds
