

a Letter to me from Newgate to Carry.

Mr. Birnie. What I have to say is that Bambridge said if I would not carry the Letter, Mr. Smith should, I did not see the Letter deliver'd to Mr. Smith, Mr. Bambridge said she should carry it, I was in the Room when Mr. Smith came back, and all I heard Bambridge say was Have you Success? and Mr. Smith said Yes.

Mr. Smith. Is that true or not? I don't remember any thing of it.

Mr. Birnie. Did you not say that Mr. Bambridge said he had changed his last Guinea, and when Mr. Smith came back he had a hundred? Bambridge told me he had changed his last Guinea or had his last Guinea in his pocket, and the next Day or that Evening Bambridge said he had a hundred. What Reason had you to give or file an Account to the Committee? Why did you suppose this Letter ^{was} carried by some body else? I did say that I talked of Lord Chief Justice Eyre with Bambridge, what I was talking about was my own Trial, & Bambridge said I have a Letter to carry to Serjeants Jun, you know where, I reply'd, if I know where I shall be an unacceptable Messenger, then he said he would get Mr. Smith to go.

Mr. Smith. When you returned to Bambridge, did he ask you what Success you had? I don't recollect it.

Mr. Birnie. When was it? I believe it was three or four Days before Bambridge was to be Tryed, and was not Tryed.
