Chief Justice Eyre had been there. You say he was
to be removed by Habeas Corpus, How was he to get
his Liberty? By being first removed and then he
was to have his Liberty by Compounding with the
Commissioners of Excise. Who was to procure that

was in Newgate? Roger Johnson said he did not
know Lord Chief Justice Eyre, and that he was not
at Newgate, and he would not swear it. Did the
Letter Express that Mr. Ogleshope and Mr. Hughes
would get his Liberty? Yes, that they would get
his Liberty, Langley told me that he believed —
Johnson had the Letter now about him. When
was this ^{Letter} sent? Johnson said it was sent the same
day. Who was it signed by? By J. C. or John
Campbell. What day? I believe it was this Day
five Weeks. Who was there? Joseph Brewer and
Tom Langley. Was Langley there all the time?
Roger Johnson said to Langley, take care of Campbell
or he will swear against you; Langley said I
don't value what he can swear, I am not afraid of
