15 s 9 d wages Customs & other charges here we
cannot yet tell, it will be found by me before the will be
laden; the mony for the masts yet standing out
about 125 £ wth I doubt not but will be paid before
the ship goes to sea again; and so soon as this
voyage be ended shall give you a particular list of
all things; now there will be about 25 £ for your
to disburse for which I have sent M^r John Raynolds
a bill upon you & pray ^{you} not to fail its payment; it
being to answer the fornight bill drawn for the salt
& therefor hand made was payable the 24th next sent;
I wish you could hear of a Chapman to buy the
ship she is now exceedingly well fitted; but if that
cannot be then if you could procure a freight any
way; for the truth is having adventures and not
ways intouraging, I have not else but rest.
