The two Posts on the River not to be relieved till further Orders and likewise that at Vizet; The Foot to March in two Columns by the left, The Dutch Artillery to March first, That of the English to follow and the Generals Baggage after them, The Baggage of the first Line must pass through the interwalls of the 2<sup>nd</sup> and March between them and the Artillery, The Baggage is to go away when the Gen<sup>l</sup> is beat; All Beatings to be taken from the left, The Quarter Mas<sup>rs</sup> to be at 4 o'clock in the Morning at the head of Erbath; Reg<sup>t</sup> and to wait there for the Quarter M<sup>rs</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> Col. Leighs Regiment is to March with the Artillery
