

Train at 3. The Baggage of the Lines to stay behind their Regiments till called for, all Waggon's that carried the Sick to be brought to the head of the first Brigade, to be exchanged One Serjeant and one Officer of the whole always to go with the 2^d Mar.^s to take care of the Straw and Forrage.

23rd May. A Court Martial at 10 o'clock to morrow Lord North President a Serj.^t & 12 Men to guard the Passage of the Rhine at Lintz, Any Soldier that takes any thing from the Boors coming to Camp shall be hanged without Mercy.

24th The Gen.^l at 3 half hour after the Assembly & to March at 4 The 2^d Mar.^s at the second Batt. Orkney at 3 The Baggage to be drawn up where the Dragoons encamped and follow y^e Train 200 Men for the Rear Guard of the Baggage

25th The Gen.^l at 4 half after the Assembly and to March at 5 None to stir his Division or Divisions, Two Officers of a Brigade to March on the Flanks to bring in Straglers, The Baggage Horses to March on the Flanks or at the head of their own Reg^ts and the Officer in Chief to answer for it, any Suttler found in the line of the March to be plundered, A List of any Men & Baggage lost this day. That the Officer of the Piquet go his Round and make his Report, around to go from the 9th Guard every hour of the Night after Eleven, the Rear Guard to be advanced 50 Paces. The Pioners as formerly all Guards as today.

26th The reveille at the usual hour and not to beat the Gen.^l till further Orders but every one to stay in Camp and be ready to March, The Boor Carts to be sent to the Artillery where others are expected, No Baggage to be sent on Board the Boats with the Sick, not to cutt Trees or Corn, The Guard to take care that no Soldier go into Town on any pretence nor any Waggon's till after the Train. March'd at 11 Forenoon

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
