To be ready to March when the Gen^l beats, which is expected
 to be very early, orders will be sent for its beating. The Baggage
 Horses to March as ordered last night.

The Gen^l at 5. The Assembly half hour after 4th March
 at 6. by the right. The Train to March at 5. Brig^d Hamilton's
 Reg^t to continue with it The Horses from Coblenz to be returned
 and a skilling aday to be paid the Boors. The Gen^l Officers
 Baggage to March between the Van Guard and the Line, &
 the Baggage of the Army between the Line and the Rear
 Guard, The Baggage Horses on the Front or the Flanks of their
 own Regiments, any Suttlers Waggon that goes before the line
 to be Plundered the Sick to March on the Flanks with a serj^t
 no Officer to leave his Post under pain of Arrest, The Guards
 for the Forrage, The Pioneers, The Van and Rear Guards as

31st No Officer or Soldier to stirr out of camp, no eating or
 cutting of corn, any Soldier who takes horses in corn is to have
 a brown Reward, To manage the Oats received, for we are to
 get none to morrow, The Meranders taken to day to be left at
 the Discretion of their Commanding Officers, Lord Darby's
 Reg^t to go to the Train, All Waggon or Horses from Coblenz
 to.
