Officers Baggage between the avant Guard and the line not to stir till called for. The Sick March as usual, but those on carts to go with the 2<sup>d</sup> Mas<sup>rs</sup> 4 Subs. with 30 each, to March with the 2<sup>d</sup> Mas<sup>rs</sup> to be disposed of by Capt Spolewood at the Villages of Grossos, Kirpsim, Hendersheim & Mimmheim to take up all Meranders and Straglers The Cap<sup>t</sup> in Weinheim to stay in the Rear of all bringing up the Detachment with him
