

May 10th 16th March at 4. The Dr. Mas^r at 2 at Ross's Reg^t: no Soldiers to leave their Ranks, to March as strong as possible, The Baggage in the Rear London. No Officer or Soldier to stir out of camp, to be ready to review to morrow at 2 o'clock. 2 camp colours at 10, to Mark y^e Ground in the Front of each Regiment

May 13th 9th B. Incamp between the Dutch Army and the Meuse. The 11th The Duke from Maestricht in the Morning and saw the Dutch Army under Arms and in the Afternoon reviewed us

May 14th Nassa. The Gen^l at 4 Assembly at 1/2 an hour after 1/2 to March at 5. The horse of both Wings to March first. The Dr. Mas^r at the Bridge at 3. 200 Men with Officers proportionably at break of day at the Artillery to receive directions from Cap^t: Bursfield, an Off^r: 120 Men of each Reg^t: for a guard on the Baggage which is to follow the Army. 300 horse and an Officer for the Rear Guard of all the horse and Dragoons to carry their Pickets. 100 Off^{rs} proportion^{lly} for a guard on the Gen^l: Officers Baggage, an Off^r: and 30 Horse at the Artillery at Break of day, The Sick to Parade at the Church in the Rear. 3 Weeks Pay to be given them.

May 15th Windsor. Brig. Webb— The Gen^l at 3 Assembly 1/2 an hour after and to March at 4. Dr. Mas^r at 3 at the Gray Dragoons, 200 with the Artillery and 20 with each Reg^t: Baggage to stay till called for. All Soldiers found from the Reg^t: without a serj^t: shall be reckoned as Meranders, The Commanders to take care there be no Straglers, an Officer to March in the Flanks to keep in the Men a Serj^t: and a File of Men with the Baggage horses, The Major to take care that all the Men be acquainted with these orders. To morrow a Soldier of the Guards and one of Merediths to be Whipt for Stragling and plundering the Boors. 100 to be left in the Quarters three hours after the Army Marches. NB. We passed the Meuse on a Bridge of Boats but the Artillery went by Maestricht

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
