This day a small party of the Enerrmys Hufars came up to our Grand Guard and push'd the advanced guard, upon the Cap^t who Commanded and obliged them to retire till pursuing them too far some of the Enerrmys Squad^s appeared & forced him back, we had only the Captains horse kill'd.

M.B. ... That the 3^d June upon advice that the Enerrmy were adrawing all their Troops together near Sikes in order to advance into y^e Plains between that and Sirkurg. The D. caused the whole Army encamp in several Bodys near Treves to march with all Expedition and possesst himself of that Ground which we feared the Enerrmy might take up. This March so surprized them, that they moved putting their right near Honingsmachien and their left at Sikes which they Fortified and Garrisoned and intrenched their Camp tho joined by a Detachment from Alsace. This Camp, tho scarce of all Provisions and Forrage is very advantageous in case of a movement towards Sarbonis to cover a siege. Orenstem
