The Wounded Sick to go to the Bread Waggon by Break of day, and to go to Tulemont, All the Horses & Carts belonging to that place to be at the Camp Guards, to be delivered to the Maliens when they demand them; The post upon the right to be relieved by a Major & 250 who is to have 2 Carts with him; One with Ammunition & another with Tools; Wheel Baggage to return to the Regiments.

N.B: Upon a false Alarm that the Enemy were passing the Dyke, to attack our Guards on the Right, the pickets were order'd out, and the first Battalion of Orkneys as being at hand, which the Enemy perceiving look to the River side & skirmished, in which the Regiment Royal lost Captain Moorhead and Horns and Eight or 9 Wounded; Six Soldiers of the Picket were likewise wounded. This Mistake was occasioned by the Major who commanded the Outguards, not knowing the River was so near and seeing the Enemy working on the other side, fancied they were passing.

N.B: The Enemy have Canonaded us in this Camp & continue it but with no success. They have abandon'd Serichot & broke down the Bridges on the Demer at that place.
