The Man with the 300 posted on the Right to be relieved by a Captain &
 50 Dragoons at Half an Hour after 10 this Night, to march to the Army &
 dismiss his Men at break of day. The Quarter Masters of each Regiment
 to be ready when call'd for at the Head of their Regiments. 50 Workmen to
 march at the Head of each Line & each Man to carry a Bush of Straw. At
 10 a Clock To night to strike our Tents & to march in Half an Hour after,
 Nobody to make any fire or any sign of marching; The Baggage
 Houses & Coaches to go to the Artillery, also the sick, The Artillery to march
 on the Left of both Lines, Every one to keep his Rank.

N^o 13 Our Heavy Baggage being sent away to Tivlemont, a Detachm^t was made
 of 18 Battalions & 20 Squadrons commanded by Col. Oxenherm & Lieuten^t
 Gen^l Henelom of Mon^t Overkirke Army & the Horse by Duke of Wurtemberg
 which march'd with the Artillery & Pontons at 8 at Night, to try to lay
 Bridges over the Dylo at Neur-wisch & Corbeck. It is the whole Army
 was on March, & about break of day the front arrived at Corbeck, where our
 Detachm^t under our Cannon had laid a Bridge & all the Grenadiers of the
 Detachm^t passed over, & had beat the Enemy from a post they had near that
 place. Mon^t Henelom did the same at his Bridge, having passed over
 with 10 Battalions and made himself Master of Neur-wisch. The Army
 being come up, my Lord Duke consulted the Generals about passing who
