

were most of Opinion that it was not practicable for the Horse, upon which his Grace gave Orders immediately to take up the Bridges & retire, The Enemy perceiving our Bridges taken, advanced to Villages on the other Side & cannonaded our Army on their March, but with no success, our Cannon did Execution among the Enemy, while our Bridges were laying.

13th: Various are the Opinions in this Affair, some think we might have passed, others that the Horse could not, and others that the Enemy would have retreated, but what appears most certain is, that the French Household & all the Bavarian and Liege Troops were come up behind the Rising Grounds, on the other Side of the River, before we fired a Cannon with Resolution to stay for us, which must have cost us very dear had we passed with success, We encamp'd this Night our Right near Meldert and Monsr. Overhike Left at Mopsut.
