

whole Army had got through the Defiles and his Grace viewing
the ground very near saw the Enemy's Post was advantageous
but was notwithstanding for Attacking them and went to concert
the Disposition with the Dutch Generals and the States Deputies
who some times were for it and afterwards against it till it was
too late this Night Mr Churchill's Detachment were acquainted
by the Duke of the Difficulties of the Passes. we lay on our Army
pitching Tents as we were drawn up in expectation to attack
the Enemy next day but it was positively refused by the Dutch
and indeed few of our own Generals were for it. The ground
being extremely disadvantageous and not at all what it had
been represented to his Grace. The Enemy cannonaded some of
our advanced Parties but did no Damage.

19 In the Morning ordered at 10 the Baggage was sent away &
