

Officers The Baggage to March to night and draw up in the Front of the right Wing of Horse they are to follow the Artillery which will come there after the feu de Joye. everyone to carry for² for to morrow, a Brigadier, also 2 Lieut Col^s 2 Maj^{rs} Officers in proportion with 1200 to be at 3 in the Morning at the Dan: Leib Regiment of Horse (Brigd^r Meredyth & Lord North the Colonel) 10 Battalions to be in readiness to March: viz Three English (viz Meredyth, Temple and Stringer) 2 hollands. 1 Hessian 2 Ireland & 2 Hanovers. The 10 Batt^{ls} that were detached were joined by ten Squadrons of our Army. (WB) and 5 Battalions and 5 Squadrons of Mons^r Overkirks and marched the next day Seperate from the Army to invest Seue under command of Lieut Gen^l Dedem. The Army encamped, The right near Weser and the left towards Ganshen comt having Turenmont in the Front of the left and Seue in the Rear of our right Mons^r Overkirk encamp his Right at Neerhespen and his left near Landen. Communication being over the hill gelt, My Lord Dukes Quarters was first taken at Walsberge but removed the next day to Turenmont
