The Regiments encamped in Bottoms or bad ground may change their camp 1200 with Officers in proportion (a Colonel &c) to be at Sumleij's Horse by 6 to morrow morning to be posted by Brigadier Cadogan's Order to secure the next Forrage. A Genl Officer of each corps to be at 9 in the Morning at the Dukis Dr all Horses and carts belonging to the Country of Liege to be immediately returned a Captain and Co at the Artillery at 5 in the Morning to receive Brigadier Blood's Orders. The 50 Workmen of each Regiment to stay in their camp till called for The Drums with two Camp Colours to be at the head of their Regiments at 4 this Afternoon. The 1200 Commanded, are to take care to sustain one another in case of any Alarm. The Sick to be sent to the Bread Waggon at one this Afternoon 150 of the English to be at Sumleij's Regiment at 9 to cover their own Forragers at the Village of Spalback.
