MB. Joined the Grand Army the 20<sup>th</sup> at Borch leen and next day to Cortwaren from whence we Marched on the 23<sup>d</sup> having intelligence that the Enemy was posted between Judgome and Bonneffe as we advanced towards Moordeorp we had an Acc<sup>t</sup> that the Enemy were putting themselves in battle to stay for us and it is thought would have Attacked us if we had not gone to them, But is immediately Resolved to Attack them and accordingly The Army advanced in 8 Columns The right wing extending towards Oute eglise in their Front, Ramilies before the center or left of the line of Foot & Taviens on the left the Enemys lines were posted behind the Villages and their right Wing close to the Mahain their left was covered almost to the center with Rivolets, and Marshy ground where the Jeet has its Source, and of very difficult Access but from Ramilies to their Right was all Plain, The Attack began on the Village of Ramilies and that part of their Line to the right of it The horse were chiefly Engaged on the Plain where it was sharply disputed, our Line having been pierced by the Enemy, but the Duke caused all the Danish Horse march to the left and Sustained the Attack which was done with such Vigour that the Enemys right wing was obliged to give way as they did soon after with their whole Army. Lord Orkney had passed the Ruisean and Marshy Grounds and had taken Possession of the Avenues of Aicheglise to attack the Enemy when he received positive Orders to retire & pass near Ramilies where after one hours March, he came almost to the same Ground, where he had been, but it was too late for the Enemy were gone and our Horse in pursue the
