

- 1706 Dragoons came up with some Regiments and cut them in pieces or took them almost every Man both our Horse and Foot continued the pursuit till dark Night, we took all the Enemy's Cannon and most of their Wheel, The Enemy in great Confusion retired by Judoigne & Biégard to Louvaine, where they did not stay long, some of the right wing went to Namur. Our Army lay that night scattered as we left off the Pursuit and met next Morning in the Plains about Raouechine
- May 23^d Fought the Battle of Ramalies, lay on our Arms all night near Biégard and Judoigne
- 24th London, 24 Battalions and 40 Squadrons at 11 this Night at Dept.^{mt} Regiment, Gen^l Churchills 2 Lt Gen^{ls} 2 Maj Gen^{ls} 82 Brigad^{rs} The ^{Raouechine} ~~Army~~ with two Camp Colours at Dept^{mt} at one The Gen^l at one The Assembly at an hour and to March at 2. For this Command of the Eng^l Major Gen^l Withers, Brigadier Webb, Batt^l 2 Orkneys, Webb's North's How's and Godfrey's M.B. This Night Gen^l Churchill was Detached to Reconnoitre the Dyle which we designed to Attack but found it abandoned by the Enemy, next day 25th The whole Army marched and passed the River near Haver and Neerijfse where we designed to have passed last Year and encamped at Terbank and Bethlehem where the Magistrates of Louvain came and made their Submission.
- 26th 500 Men with a Colonel to March immediately to Louvain (Coll^l of the Dutch) and to encamp within the Town, Gen^l at 4 Assembly half an hour after and to March at 5, on Sunday a thanksgiving for our Victory. The ~~Army~~ to be at Lieb Regiment of Danes at 3. and 6 Regiments to March with them.
- 26th The Army March towards Brussels which the Enemy abandoned and the Marquis de Bynse the Governour sent a Letter to the D. to notify it, The Enemy retired from the Canal between Brussels & Vilvoord to Alost and our Army encamped this Night at Beaubion and Diggham where the Magistrates of Brussels & deput^{es} of 4 States of Brabant made their Submission
- Lord
