To Forrage for 2 days none to stir from camp and to be ready to March at the first Order, The Provost to go his Rounds & to hang all the Meranders he finds, The Posts between Brussels & Vilvoorde are a Subaltern and 30 at each of the following places viz: Lestroisstron, The Wind Mill near it and the Pent and Lakene to hinder every body from passing the canal and Soldiers going into Brussels without leave an Officer and 30 to be posted at the pont brui, an Officer to go with the Men for straw. NB. The Army having passed the Canal between Brussels and Vilvoorde Gen Churchill got the Government of Brussels and was sent on with 4 Battalions.

Malines Leer and Vilvoorde made likewise their Submission & Garrisons were sent to them, The Enemy Marched from Alost, toward, Laver & Ghent
