M.B. We continued to view the Posts and gave the necessary directions for the security of the camp and likewise began our lines of circumvallation at our side of the Inundation we had 9000 Boors ordered but not 7000 ever appeared and of those several missing every minute all we have were sett to Work, our camp seems very plentiful and will certainly continue so, if good order be kept.
