The right Wing of the Dukes Army has made amovement towards D, Ottignies, and the left between Helchin (his Dr) & Port Despierres

If any Regiment want money at Ghent they may apply to the Brigadier of the day all the Majors of Brigade on the other side to encamp at the General's Quarters and those on this side at the English Brigade. 150 to be at the Bridge at 4 in the Morning to go make saucissons they shall be paid for them. and must be 13 and 10 foot sizes 3 Sergeants with them who shall likewise be paid, an Officer from the Artillery will call for them at the Bridge 50 Men to reinforce the Artillery Guard, Orders given Yesterday to be obeyed a Subaltern of every 2 Regiments to look after the Workmen. The Boors to go for Bread to morrow at the Bridges M^r du Troussell to be taken notice of as Brigadier of the King of Prussias Troops. a Guard to be given to the States Commissary. Orders henceforth to be given at 11.

MB The Enemy from 12 to 2 in the Afternoon made a great Fire of their Artillery round the Town and under favour of that Fire sent out a party at the Bridges Port, and set several Houses on Fire near our Camp we hear this Fire was occasioned by a Solemnity of the Garrison vowing allegiance to the Governor.
