They are to be as large above as below and the Pickets strong and fast to be paid for as many as they make no body to Torrage in Houses and to respect the safe guards in writting the same as if there was a Man, each Battalion to have 2 sentrys upon their Works before them. not to suffer any to walk upon them all who come in at the Barriers to be sent to the Officers of the Guard.
