No Cessation of Arms with the Enemy till the Genl gives leave.
 The Trenches to be relieved to night by Major General's Pallant &
 Prince Sonderberg, Brigadiers Nassau W. and Truesell with 7
 Battalions, Donop. Albermarle, Salische, Lontland Mon, Looon
 pr. and St Paul. At 7 this night a Lieutenant Colonel, Major V.
 and 900 Workmen to be at the pr. Danvergn's Quarters where an
 Engineer will call for them. They are to be relieved at three in
 the Morning by 400 The Major of the Trenches to take care they
 get Tools, 2 Field Officers and 800 Workmen at 7 to night at Pallant's
 Regiment where one from the Artillery will call for them they
 are to be relieved in the Morning by 600 The Majors of the Regimts
 to visit their Posts in the Trenches The commanders of the
 Regiments to take care the Men take Fascines pickets & Mallets
 and that they lay them down where they are Ordered the Officers
 to take care that the Workmen be kept together & do their Work
 The Majors of Brigade to see them paid by Mons. Brockhausen

MB The Enemy kept a great Fire from their counterscarp and
 threw several Bombs towards our Trenches which did no harm
 in the Afternoon they shewed some Peletons on the Glacis as if
 they designed a sally to draw our Men into the Fire of their Cannon
 but they did not advance all night at the relieving of Trenches
 there was some Confusion among our Battalions upon false
 Alarms which occasioned several of our Battalions to make
 great Fire from the Trenches, our Bridge of Communication
 upon the Inundation was finished being 330 paces in length
