Danvergnis D^{ns} they shall have double pay at 6 a Field Officer and 300 Workmen to assemble at the prussian Guards and to be relieved in the Morning by 2 Captains and 200 Men a Field Officer and 400 to be at the prince Danvergnis to be relieved in the Morning. by 200 The Volunteers to have the same pay, they had at Ostend.
