

MB. My Lord Marlborough came to the Army and visited the
 Trenches we finished 2 boijeans ala Sappe from the 2^d Paralell
 and began a 3^d Paralelle a la Sappe within 200 Paces of the Glacis
 on the right of our Attack, and made anew Battery to beat the
 Flank of the curtains and the small work went to the Inunda-
 tion which the Enemy perceiving raised a Battery on their
 Wall above the Inundation Brigadier Capoll died of his Wound
 All Night the Enemy endeavoured to make a sally upon our
 safe Work with 400 Men and some of their Officers came up to it
 and threw down some Gabions but were not sustained by
 their Men. Our Workmen took a Lieutenant (Regt. Sparr)
 Prisoner without any loss

The Trenches, The Regiments Inf. Mr. Vegelin, Fagel, Rank Landen
 Lalo and Gorin. The General will post Banks himself a Lieut.
 Colonel Vboos for Work at the Batteries a Field Officer Vboos more
 for the Trenches to be relieved in the Morning. The Regiments
 and Workmen to be at the Parade at 11. This afternoon 100 to be
 Commanded to carry Woolpacks &c and all the Officers who
 Command the Work are to obey the Engineers, The Regiments to
 take but 3 Drums into the Trenches & the Workmen none.

MB We run two small Works ala demi Sappe from our third
 Paralell upon the Glacis, that on the right next the Inunda-
 tion being very near the Counterscarp we continued to beat
 the Flanks of the Works with our New Battery The Enemy threw
 aprodigious many Bombs and fired from Cannon on a
 Battery they made on their Wall between the Attack and the
 Port de Lille above the Inundation most of their Bombs came
 near the new Battery but did no great harm, we threw
 our
