MB... My Lord Marlborough come here and had a conference with
the States where it was resolved to Attack the Counterscarp to mor-
row night. This Night the Engineers were commanded to make
Foot Banks to the very top of the Trenches for the easier going out
and the Miners wrought the whole night, we had only 3 or 4 Men
wounded.

Granads, and every Grenadier to get half a crown and each
Serjeant a crown bounty Money, The Regiments and Workmen to
be
