to sustain and ordered some of them to lay down their Arms
 to Work to finish the Lodgment as soon as possible to be out of
 the Enemy's Fire, which had very much Gallied our Workmen
 abundance of them being gone off some wounded and others
 helping the Wounded on the right likewise Mons Sholtz sent out
 the Battalions of Lander and Lottum. In the Attack The Enemy
 sprang 2 small Mines on the left but did no great damage, about
 2 in the Morning our Lodgements were so perfect that the Men were
 quite secure from the Enemy's Fire but the Lodgements of both
 Attacks were not joined Lord Orkney staid in the Trenches till
 Morning that the Relief of Workmen came. We reckoned to have
 lost 3 Field Officers wounded, 8 Captains killed and 15 wounded
 16 Subalterns killed and 28 wounded 11 Serjeants killed & 45
 wounded 240 Men killed & 900 wounded besides the Grenad^{rs}
 and Workmen, the Regiments who suffered most were Ingoldby
 Callant, Lander & Lottum

WB My Lord Duke moved his Army, his right Wing to Laue
 nearer us and his left extended to Pont Despierres

For the Trenches to morrow Maj^r Genl Callant and Brigadier
 Du Troissell. Battalions, Webb, Rantzau, Hasklom Heyden

 be rewarded, every Regiment to send a Waggon at 3 in the
 Afternoon to carry Gabions. 600 with a Lieut. Col: at the Batterys
 400 Workmen for its right and as many for the left relieved
 each in the Morning by 200 WB. That the Regiments mounted
 in the Morning and staid till the 21. at Night we wrought all
 day to perfect the Lodgements on the Counterscarp and to make
 Traverses
