

Traverses to hinder us from being enfilied from the Ravelin & Bastion, at night our Miners began to Work on the Descent to the Tossie at the Ravelins and our Batterys on the counterscarp one for 5 and another for 6 pieces of Cannon we had between 40 and 50 Men killed and wounded

For the Trenches, Maj^r Gen^l Week, Brigadier Amama, The Majors of Brigade to command the Workmen according to the Strength of the Regiments, Commanders of Regiments are not to Draw out their Regiments without order from the General, The killed to be buried in the Trenches and for every one that they bury they shall have 50 Stivers, The Officers commanded with the Workmen to take care they do their Work and as they go off to see there be none wanting. Those wanting shall be well punished and not paid. To morrow the Regiments to give Waggon as to Day this Night 150 Workmen at each Attack to be relieved in Morning by 100. 700 Workmen for the Batteries and 100 for the Sakers to be relieved in the Morning by the like number.

MB. We continued to Work at our Batterys and threw a great many Stones into the Ravelin, we likewise enlarged our lodgements and our Miners wrought heartily we made an Epaulment to cover the Battery that was to beat in Breach. we had this Day and night about 30 Men killed and wounded.
