March'd in the Night The Count de Tilly with 2 Lieut. Generals
Albermarle and Sholls, were Detached with 40 Squadrons and
5000 Grenadiers to endeavour to fall upon the Enemy's Rear but
because the Army did not all get into their Camp before 10 at
night Count Tilly could not advance far with the Detachm. before day

Count Tully having marched by the Chappel of Cornelis weert came
up near the Enemy's Rear Guard and perceived a good body of Foot
sent to acquaint the Duke that he was in presence of the Enemy
upon which Count doltman and Lieut General Dolphi with 20 Batt^s
and 30 Squadrons and 12 pieces of Cannon were ordered to March
to sustain them but the Enemy still Marching off Count Tully with
the Horse and Dragoons came up with their Rear and caused the
Dragoons to Attack some foot (ours not being able to keep up) but
they were so well posted in the Hedges that it was impossible to
make any thing of it without Foot so he thought it convenient to
let them go off. and returned to the Camp with the Detachment
having lost two Officers and some Troopers killed & wounded
at 7 this Night we had advice that the Enemy after they had
made a halt at Le Grand Reoua were marched and Incamped
near St Denis and Ville fur Haime
