Inemy perceived us upon the heights they began to Decamp and
March'd in the Night. The Count de Tilly with 2 Lieut Generals
Albermarle and Sholts, were Detached with 40 Squadrons and
5000 Grenadiers to endeavour to fall upon the Inemy's rear but
because the Army did not all get into their Camp before 10 at
night Count Tilly could not advance far with the Detachm^t before day

The Genl at 3 Assembly half an hour after and March at 6
The Drms at 3 at the Bridge of Boats on the right of the Line. The
1000 Men command'd Yesterday for Work to March with the
Drms Two Battalions to be command'd to the Baggage at
Pionniers

MB. Count Tilly having marched by the Chappel of Cornelisweert came
up near the Inemy's Rear Guard and perceived a good body of Foot
sent to acquaint the Duke that he was in presence of the Inemy
upon which Count Dolfin and Lieut General Dolph with 20 Batt.
and 30 Squadrons and 12 pieces of Cannon were ordered to March
to sustain them but the Inemy still Marching off Count Tilly with
the Horse and Dragoons came up with their Rear and caused the
Dragoons to Attack some foot (ours not being able to keep up) but
they were so well posted in the Hedges that it was impossible to
make any thing of it without Foot so he thought it convenient to
let them go off and returned to the Camp with the Detachment
having lost two Officers and some Troopers killed & wounded
at this Night we had advice that the Inemy after they had
made a halt at Le Grand Reux were marched and encamped
near St Denis and Ville sur Haine
